He said that the interesting thing about our situation is that with the income and the expenses, there is this lag time between the time the vendors in our respective cities collect the tax, send to the cities, and the cities send to the air service board. So sometimes our financial statements are a little bit skewed. Brown offered that, in his opinion, it is a good idea to have a couple of hundred thousand dollars in reserves due to the lag he mentioned. The Board asked a few questions to which Brown responded.

#### 5. Receive and file Allocation of Voting Rights Report for 2021

Mayor Hendricks noted that the gap is widening, and we appreciate all that the cities have done in doing the best to make these numbers larger and larger each year. Blaine County Chairman Greenberg noted that he is happy with all that the cities are doing as well. Mayor Bradshaw noted that we are all contributing, it is well worth it and we'll need it in the future to get people to come back after this pandemic.

# Sun Valley Air Service Board February 2021 Operational Highlights | December - January

#### **Executive Summary**

February brings us into the full swing of winter. The much needed and welcomed recent snowfall has left the Valley with a fresh coat and renewed excitement for the season. Outdoor adventure seekers continue to take advantage of the endless opportunities that we have right out our collective backdoor including Nordic skiing, snowshoeing, backcountry/downhill skiing, snowmobiling, skating, fly fishing, fat biking, and more. It's been great to see people being active and smiling through it all.

With all the positives also comes some challenges. An unstable snowpack brought about extremely dangerous avalanche conditions. Additionally, the increased outdoor user base has created compression on trailhead parking, trail usage, and lift lines. In an effort to keep people safe and manage expectations, we have actively been messaging avalanche reports, created a recreation parking map in conjunction with SV Trekking & Backwoods, and pushed updates from the Sun Valley Resort.

We continue to tip-toe around the "Critical" COVID status here in Blaine County with cases showing no signs of letting up. Despite the current situation, much of town feels like business as usual. Hotels, restaurants, retail, and other entities continue to stay open and operating as best they can with the best safety protocols in place. For most visitors, the experience is a slice of normalcy from what they have been experiencing.

Traveler trends remain focused on the near term. Short lead times in hotel bookings and cancelations make it difficult to predict the weekly visitation to the area. Tax collections indicate that there are people in town spending money. These are likely second homeowners, friends and family taking advantage of their connections to the area. Hotel occupancies for the start of 2021 are tough to match when comparing to the record-breaking numbers from 2020 thanks in part to increased group visits such as the National Brotherhood of skiers. Enplanements show continued hesitation in traveling by air. Enplanements numbers indicate a lingering hesitation to fly in favor of traveling by car instead.

The newly updated and implemented approach pattern into the Friedman Memorial Airport has been a huge win. Numerous flights that would have been diverted in December due to weather were able to successfully land without issue. This advancement presents an ongoing opportunity to build on our first-time visitor experience.

We remain watchful and nimble in our efforts to safely invite visitors to the area this winter. Our role as educators and destination managers prevails at the forefront of our efforts as we embrace winter head-on. Marketing and advertising efforts stick to leveraging the outdoor access in the form of backcountry & Nordic skiing, snowshoeing, downhill skiing on SKI Magazine's #1 ranked mountain, and beyond. EPIC pass holders, past guests, friends & families (especially those in our nonstop flight markets), are the main target audiences. With interest from drive markets, PR efforts to drum up earned media in those areas will also be brought into the fold. Last but not least, we carry on with information to guests regarding the best health & safety practices as well as how to be a responsible traveler and recreator. The lifting of travel restrictions such as the one in California and the rolling out of the vaccine gives us hope for the remainder of the winter. We're half-way there!

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#### **Promotions**

We were faced with the national political unrest and the changing of administration. In an effort to steer clear of the chatter, we paused our social media spends until the presidential inauguration was held. We did continue to run our endemic winter sports partnerships with outlets such at Teton Gravity Research, Matador Network, Unofficial Networks, the Ski Journal, and Open Snow. Early indicators point to expected engagement with increases in organic search traffic.

Our concept of "Nowhere is Everything" based off of the creative ideation from Two Things is at the helm of our video and display advertising. Sun Valley is blessed with the dichotomies that many travelers are currently seeking. Think, "less traffic, more open spaces", "fewer lift lines, more skiing", "minimal screens, maximum connections", etc.

We will continue to monitor travel restrictions, local health impacts and overall traveler sentiment. This season is less about attracting new visitors and more focused around engaging those that are familiar with us. Our role continues to shift to one that inform those who do visit us to be respectful and knowledgeable about the safety, cultural, and recreational expectations that Sun Valley embodies.

#### PR

PR has been a major component of our current efforts amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. We have worked closely with our PR firm, Fahlgren-Mortine, where appropriate to help guide local stakeholders on addressing the incoming media inquiries. Remote journalist inquiries have begun to build. In-person journalist hosting demand continues to be weak.

We've received a surprising number of inquiries from journalists looking to visit the area and many of these have been fulfilled including two visitations from Forbes' writers.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FY21 ADDENDUM

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is hereby made and entered effective to October 1, 2020, by and between the Sun Valley Air Service Board ("Board"), a joint powers authority of the State of Idaho, and the Fly Sun Valley Alliance ("FSVA"), an Idaho non-profit corporation (collectively "Parties").

#### WHEREAS:

- A. The Parties have entered into a *Contract for Services Between the Sun Valley Air Services Board and FSVA*, effective January 31, 2018 ("Contract").
- B. The Contract, Provision 5(B) provides that FSVA shall maintain a contract with Sun Valley Company ("SVC") for 50% reimbursement in cash of Air Service Contract Costs. Said reimbursements shall include a cash payment for 50% of MRG costs, and other contributions for at least 50% of other Air Service Contract costs.
- C. The Parties jointly and collectively desire that for fiscal year 2021 (FY21), Provision 5(B) should be clarified to specify that it is acceptable for the SVC 50% contribution to be made in cash and/or in-kind contributions.

THEREFORE, the Parties hereby mutually agree that, for FY21 only, Provision 5(B) shall be temporarily amended to read as follows:

FSVA shall maintain a contract with SVC wherein SVC shall reimburse FSVA for 50% of Air Service Contract Costs. Said reimbursements shall include cash and/or in-kind (equivalent cash value) contributions totaling 50% of Air Service Contract Costs.

The Parties hereto have caused this MOU to be executed by their duly-authorized representatives.
